DOUGLAS POLICE DEPARTMENT RECEIVES FIREHOUSE SUBS GRANT

The Douglas Police Department has been awarded \$11,400.00 from Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation Grant Program. The Police Department will utilize the grant funds to equip (8) eight patrol cars with Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs).

The AEDs will allow DPD officers to provide on-scene, lifesaving assistance in situations where a sudden cardiac arrest may occur. The devices have the ability to analyze the heart's rhythm and, when necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm.

It's WORTH A SHOT Choose To VAX UP

In an effort to slow the spread of COVID-19, the City of Douglas has launched the “It’s Worth A Shot-Vax Up” Incentive Program to help boost the number of vaccinated residents in Douglas, Georgia. The program is a part of the City’s plan to distribute funds from ARPA funding to citizens of Douglas for becoming fully vaccinated. A one-time amount of \$200 will be given to the first 1,500 fully-vaccinated individuals, who become fully vaccinated between January 1, 2022 – April 30, 2022. To receive the \$200, each individual **must live** in the city limits of Douglas at the time the application is submitted. Applications may be downloaded from www.cityofdouglasga.gov or picked up at the Community Development office (211 S. Gaskin Avenue). Applications **must be** submitted to the Community Development office anytime between January 1, 2022 – May 15, 2022.

Rural Zone Tax Credits

for Property Purchase, Building Rehabilitation, and Job Creation

Douglas

Are you considering purchasing a building in downtown?
Do you already own a building and are interested in renovating it?
Perhaps you are a new business that has created jobs or an existing business that has recently added new employees.

If any of these seem applicable to you, you may be eligible for State Income Tax credits for your business if it is located within the City of Douglas' Rural Zone.

See map of designated Rural Zone boundaries on reverse side of this sheet.

Tax credits you may be eligible for:

The Job Tax Credit <ul style="list-style-type: none">• For a new business owner that creates at least 2 new jobs or an existing business that hires at least 2 new employees• At least two net, new full-time equivalent jobs (<i>an aggregate of employee worked hours totaling 40 hours per week between two or more employees</i>) must be created to qualify• Equal to \$2,000 per new full-time equivalent job per year, up to 5 years and not to exceed \$200,000 total or \$40,000 per year	The Investment Tax Credit <p>This credit is for investors who purchase a building within the designated Rural Zone. The credit is equivalent to 25% of the purchase price, not to exceed \$125,000 total or \$25,000 per year. At least two net, new full-time equivalent jobs must be created and maintained at the property location to qualify for the investment credit.</p>
	The Rehabilitation Tax Credit <p>This credit is to offset development costs associated with the rehabilitation of a property located within a designated Rural Zone. The credit is equivalent to 30% of the qualified rehabilitation costs, not to exceed \$150,000 total or \$50,000 per year. At least two net, new full-time equivalent jobs must be created and maintained at the property location to qualify for the rehabilitation credit.</p>

In 2020, the City of Douglas was designated as a RURAL Zone by the Georgia Department of Community Affairs. Downtown businesses that are located within the RURAL Zone may qualify for tax credits relating to property purchase, rehabilitation costs, and job creation.

Investors who purchase a building in the RURAL Zone may receive an Investment Tax Credit which is which is equivalent to 25% of the purchase price of the building. A business owner who rehabilitates a business in the Zone may qualify for a Rehabilitation Tax Credit equivalent to 30% of qualified rehabilitation costs. If a business in the Zone creates new jobs or hires at least 2 new employees, that business may qualify for the Job Tax Credit, which offers \$2,000 per new full-time equivalent job created. Each of the three tax credits is dependent upon the creation of at least two new full-time equivalent jobs.

Teen Dating Violence Awareness and Prevention Month

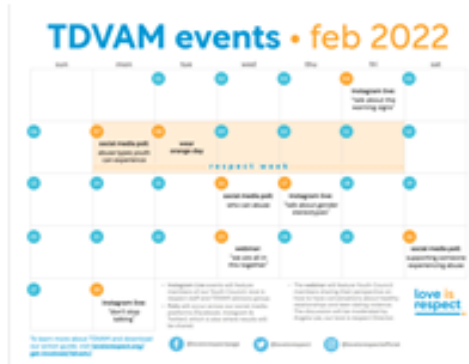

HOW TO RECOGNIZE AND RESPOND TO OPIOID OVERDOSES



ANYONE WHO MISUSES OPIOIDS IS AT RISK OF OVERDOSE

The risk can be much higher for those who have built a tolerance, mix opioids with alcohol or other depressants, or take laced or illicit opioids.

THE SIGNS OF OVERDOSE ARE SUBTLE



SLEEP-LIKE STATE

Unresponsive, limp, or passed out posture.



CHANGES IN APPEARANCE

Clammy skin or blue lips or nails.



TROUBLE BREATHING

Slowed, stopped, or heavy gurgling.



LOW HEART RATE

Slowed or completely stopped pulse.



4-6 Minutes

RESPONSE TIME

It only takes 4-6 minutes before lack of oxygen can lead to brain damage or death.

IF YOU SEE AN OPIOID OVERDOSE REMEMBER TO A.C.T.

REMINDER: Stay with the person and monitor their breathing. Someone who has overdosed needs oxygen and may need CPR. Do NOT run. The Good Samaritan Law legally protects those who call and receive help.
