Pilgrim's Expanding Douglas Complex

On Tuesday, May 3, 2022, The City of Douglas and the Douglas Coffee County Chamber and Economic Development Authority announced the expansion of Pilgrim's Pride Corporation's complex in the City of Douglas. Pilgrim's, an American-based food company that processes, prepares, packages, and delivers fresh, frozen, and value-added food products for customers in more than 100 countries, will invest \$75 million in an expansion in Douglas, Georgia. The expansion will create 53 new permanent, good-paying jobs, as well as dozens of construction and trade jobs during development of the facility. For full press release,

DON'T JUST DREAM—DREAM BIG!

In 2016, a small group of concerned citizens, City of Douglas, and Board of Education officials held a meeting that would impact the lives of all children in Douglas and Coffee County. The city embarked on a plan to build an area in Douglas that would service all citizens. City officials had bigger dreams than just a Miracle Field at the Davis Wade Park location. What began as a vision of the late Commissioner Johnnie Lee Roper to have a baseball field for special needs children in Douglas evolved into a revitalized park for generations to come. The City of Douglas has a swim team that has won both team and individual GRPA State Swim Titles for several years and they were practicing in a pool that was built in the 1950s. Seeing a need for a competition-sized pool, it was decided to add a new eight-lane pool, pool house, and splash pad to the renovations at Davis Wade. With the passage of SPLOST 2017, plans were drawn up, revised, and finally implemented in 2021 for the Davis Wade Park capital improvement project. For the full story, www.cityofdouglasga.gov.



CITY OFFERS INCENTIVES FOR ENTERPRISE ZONES

In accordance with the State of Georgia's Enterprise Zone Employment Act of 1997, the City of Douglas has established five (5) Enterprise Zones in the city to encourage revitalization and investment in the areas. Property owners, who apply for the incentive program and successfully achieve and maintain the criteria set by the program, may qualify for abatement of municipal ad valorem (property) taxes for a ten (10) year period on business, commercial, and residential properties within the established Enterprise Zone geographic areas. CITY COMMISSION MEETING TIME CHANGES TO 6 PM

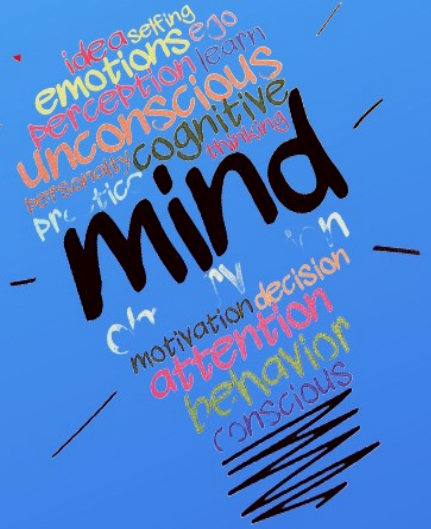

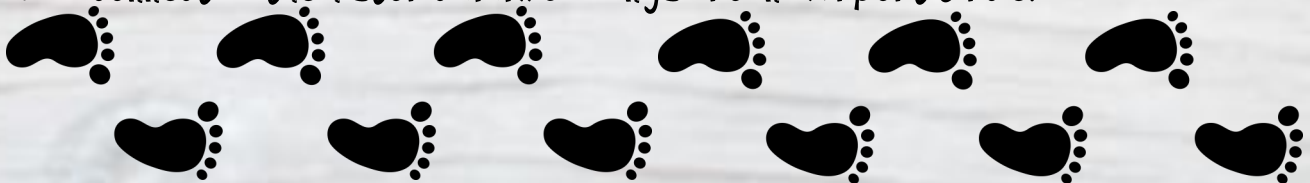
City Hall Project Almost Complete!

OPERATION QUALITY OF LIFE WRAP-UP

- Pool and Spa Violations – 2

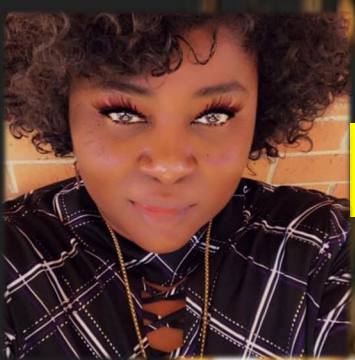

WEATHERIZATION GRANT PROGRAM

The City of Douglas has grant funding to assist qualified senior city residents with limited weatherization improvements to their home.

Adults 55-64 years of age may qualify for:

⇒ **50% Grant and 50% Applicant Match Program**

Adults 65 years of age or older may qualify for:

⇒ **75% Grant and 25% Applicant Match Program**

MAXIMUM amount eligible per household is \$5,000, including labor costs.

Eligible Energy Items:
HVAC Replacement—(1) per structure
Attic Insulation & Ventilation



REQUIREMENTS:

- Must be a resident of the City of Douglas and a U.S. Citizen
- Must be the Utility Account holder or listed on the utility accounts.
- Must be current on Utility account and not a participant of the City of Douglas Utility Payment Plan.
- Must meet current HUD income limits. This program serves homeowners with incomes at or below 80% of the area median, adjusted for household size. Income is the full amount prior to payroll deductions.
- Must provide proof of home ownership.
- Must occupy structure as primary residence.
- Must provide proof of insurance.
- Must allow qualified city staff to conduct an energy audit to determine the needed improvements.
- **MANUFACTURED HOMES** are eligible provided they are permanently affixed (made substantially immobile by the use of brick, wood, or masonry underpinning with wheels and axles removed).
- **RENTAL PROPERTY** is not eligible.
