The City of Douglas and Coffee County will receive \$4,577,848.00 in grant funding to use toward the rehabilitation of Huckaby Complex, Roundtree Park, and the Soccer Field.

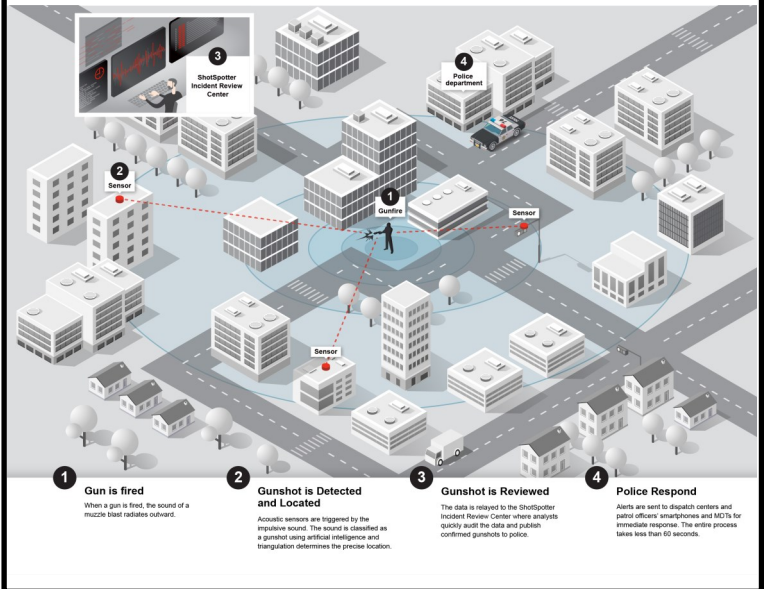

The City of Douglas has received confirmation that they have been awarded funding from the Georgia Department of Natural Resources through their Land and Water Conservation Fund. This funding is provided for the acquisition, development, and rehabilitation of outdoor recreation lands and facilities. The City of Douglas will receive \$278,000.00 from this grant funding to use towards improvements for Unity Park. In addition to the grant award, the City of Douglas has committed to investing \$293,000.00 in this project for a total estimated cost of completion of \$571,000.00.

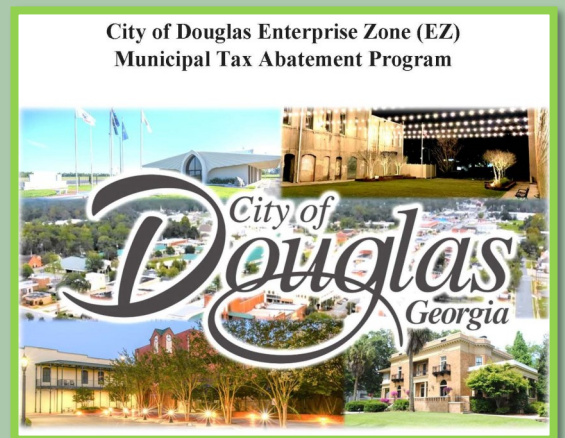


On June 8 2023, Governor Brian Kemp announced that the Douglas Police Department has a project that is among 118 projects to receive a grant to improve community-level public safety measures and address law enforcement staffing challenges that arose during the COVID-19 pandemic. **CITY OFFERS INCENTIVES FOR ENTERPRISE ZONES**

In accordance with the State of Georgia's Enterprise Zone Employment Act of 1997, the City of Douglas has established five (5) Enterprise Zones in the city to encourage revitalization and investment in the areas. Property owners, who apply for the incentive program and successfully achieve and maintain the criteria set by the program, may qualify for abatement of municipal ad valorem (property) taxes for a ten (10) year period on business, commercial, and residential properties within the established Enterprise Zone geographic areas. - ✓ If possible, all items must be placed curbside for pick-up. **ONLY PLACE ITEMS AT CURBSIDE ONCE NOTIFIED THAT PICK-UP WILL OCCUR.**
- ✓ Acceptable brown and white good items include furniture, washing machines, refrigerators, dryers, stoves, microwaves, televisions, etc. All chemicals **MUST BE** drained from appliances.
- ✓ **NO** hazardous chemicals such as paints/solvents, household cleaners, pesticides or herbicides, motor oil, antifreeze, batteries, or tires will be collected.

**Due to the limited time allowed pick up dates, a limited number of pickups will be allowed, however, a comprehensive list will be kept in an effort to reach out to all citizens requesting this service. 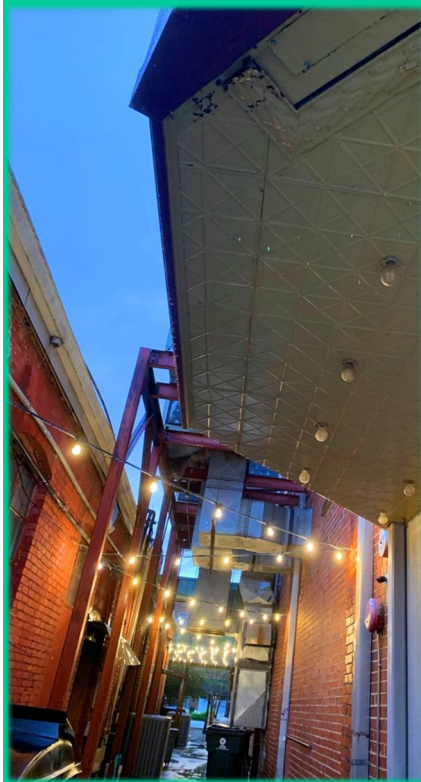

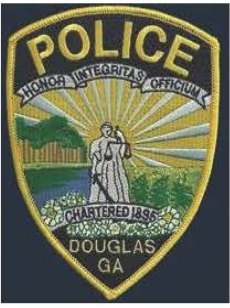

## DOWNTOWN ALLEY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

The Downtown Alleyway Beautification Project is underway. The project is a collaboration with the City of Douglas, the Downtown Development Authority, and the Community Foundation of Coffee County and focuses on reimagining our alleyways to make them become more engaging and welcoming public spaces. The project also hopes to improve mobility to our downtown businesses. Strand lighting has been installed throughout downtown in several areas to provide better lighting for safety so the alleys may be used by businesses and citizens. Other included improvements include faux ivy, potted plants with seasonal colors, fragrance misters, and wall art. ## WEATHERIZATION GRANT PROGRAM

The City of Douglas has grant funding to assist qualified senior city residents with limited weatherization improvements to their home.

**Adults 55-64 years of age may qualify for:**

⇒ **50% Grant and 50% Applicant Match Program**

**Adults 65 years of age or older may qualify for:**

⇒ **75% Grant and 25% Applicant Match Program**

**MAXIMUM amount eligible per household is \$5,000, including labor costs.**

**Eligible Energy Items:**  
HVAC Replacement—(1) per structure  
Attic Insulation & Ventilation



### REQUIREMENTS:

- Must be a resident of the City of Douglas and a U.S. Citizen
- Must be the Utility Account holder or listed on the utility accounts.
- Must be current on Utility account and not a participant of the City of Douglas Utility Payment Plan.
- Must meet current HUD income limits. This program serves homeowners with incomes at or below 80% of the area median, adjusted for household size. Income is the full amount prior to payroll deductions.
- Must provide proof of home ownership.
- Must occupy structure as primary residence.
- Must provide proof of insurance.
- Must allow qualified city staff to conduct an energy audit to determine the needed improvements.
- **MANUFACTURED HOMES** are eligible provided they are permanently affixed (made substantially immobile by the use of brick, wood, or masonry underpinning with wheels and axles removed).
- **RENTAL PROPERTY** is not eligible.

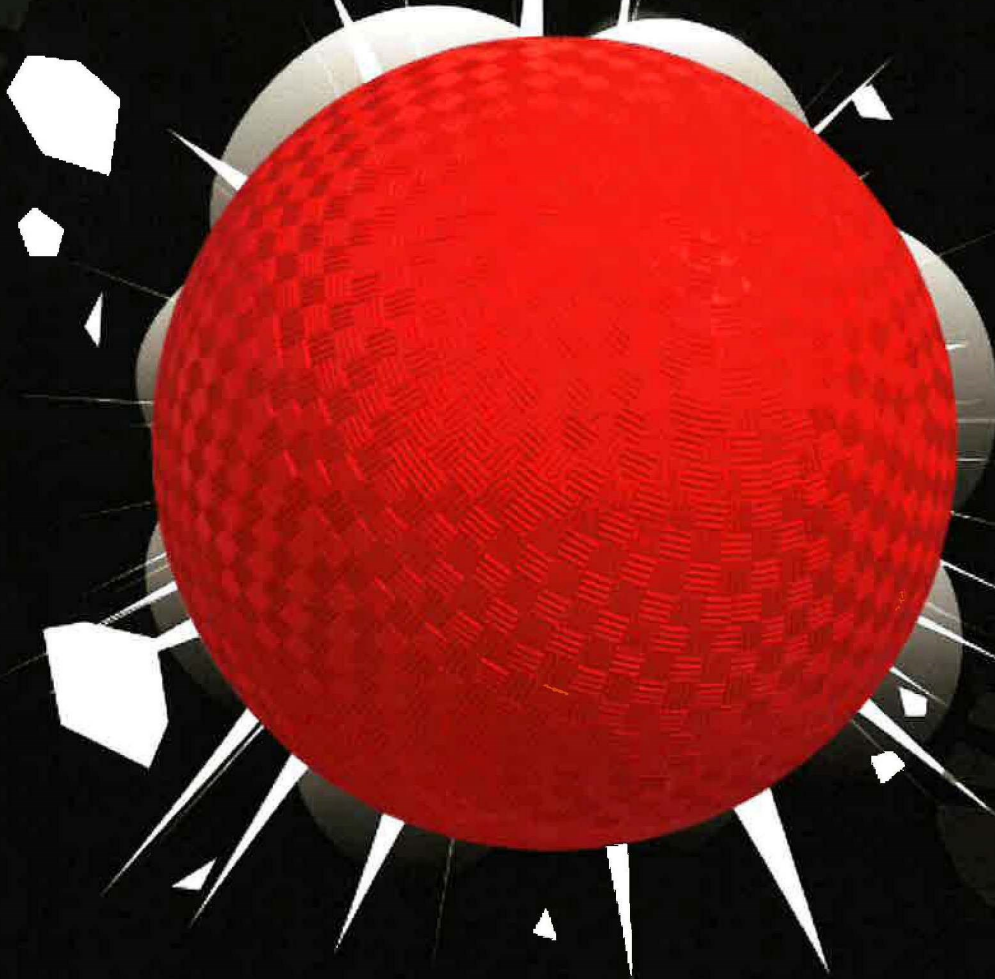

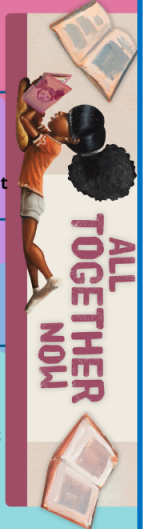

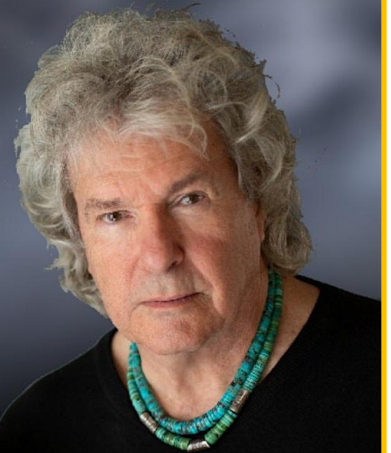
