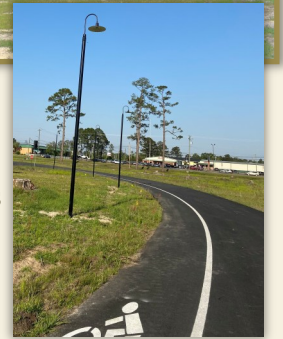

Discover Douglas' Aviation History at the WWII Air Base!!

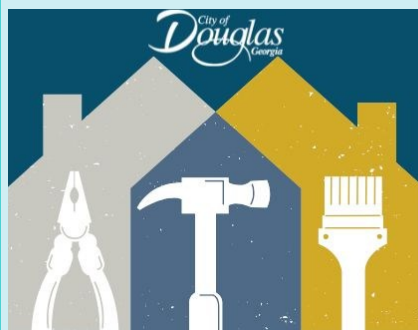



\$ \$50,000,000

The State of Georgia allocated \$50,000,000 for public infrastructure projects to help recover from the impacts of disasters in 2023 and 2024.

Covered disasters include Hurricane Idalia (DR-4738), Tropical Storm Debby (DR-4821), and Hurricane Helene (DR-4830).

These funds were appropriated under Public Law 118-158, enacted on December 21, 2024.

The Georgia Department of Community Affairs (DCA) oversees the administration of CDBG-DR funds.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development allocated Disaster Recovery funds to the State of Georgia to address the unmet needs of the communities as a result of the 2023-2024 Hurricanes.

DCA administers the Infrastructure Program, which will provide \$50,000,000 in CDBG-DR funds to eligible communities impacted by Hurricane Idalia, Tropical Storm Debby, and Hurricane Helene. The Infrastructure Program's goal is to help communities recover from these storms and become more resilient for future disasters by funding public infrastructure projects.

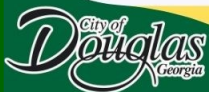

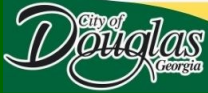

Cooking Safety

Cooking brings family and friends together, provides an outlet for creativity and can be relaxing. But did you know that cooking fires are the number one cause of home fires and home injuries? By following a few safety tips you can prevent these fires.

"COOK WITH CAUTION"

- Be on alert! If you are sleepy or have consumed alcohol don't use the stove or stovetop.
- Stay in the kitchen while you are frying, boiling, grilling, or broiling food. If you leave the kitchen for even a short period of time, turn off the stove.
- If you are simmering, baking, or roasting food, check it regularly, remain in the home while food is cooking, and use a timer to remind you that you are cooking.
- Keep anything that can catch fire — oven mitts, wooden utensils, food packaging, towels or curtains — away from your stovetop.

If you have a small (grease) cooking fire and decide to fight the fire...

- On the stovetop, smother the flames by sliding a lid over the pan and turning off the burner. Leave the pan covered until it is completely cooled.
- For an oven fire, turn off the heat and keep the door closed.

If you have any doubt about fighting a small fire...

- Just get out! When you leave, close the door behind you to help contain the fire.
- Call 9-1-1 or the local emergency number from outside the home.



Cooking and Kids

Have a "kid-free zone" of at least 3 feet (1 metre) around the stove and areas where hot food or drink is prepared or carried.

FACTS

- ! The leading cause of fires in the kitchen is unattended cooking.
- ! Most cooking fires in the home involve the kitchen stove.



Turkey fryers that use cooking oil are not safe. These fryers use large amounts of oil at high temperatures, which can cause devastating burns. If you want a fried turkey for your Thanksgiving meal, purchase it from a grocery store, restaurant or buy a fryer that does not use oil. [Dangers of Turkey Fryers](#)

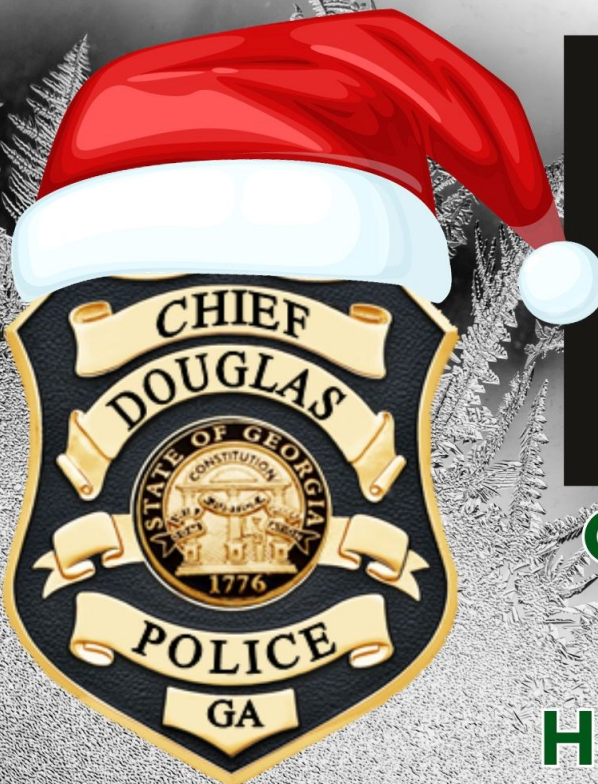

CALL 855-360-7475 FOR A RIDE.

Call between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m., Monday-Friday,
the day before you want to ride.
Services are curb to curb.

BEST TIME TO RIDE

Off peak times are the best times to ride.
Try to schedule appointments during the
following times to increase chance of seat
availability.

OFF PEAK TIMES

Monday through Friday: 10 a.m. - 2 p.m.
Last pickup is at 5:30 p.m.

FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED

Call as early as possible. Call up to one week
in advance to schedule a ride.

ACCESSIBILITY

The transit services is handicap accessible to provide transportation for the disabled community. The lift-equipped vehicles meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements.

Be sure to indicate the need for a lift-equipped vehicle and/or additional assistance at the time you make your trip request.

Drivers will assist individuals in safely boarding and exiting from the vehicles. Individuals with mobility impairments who need special assistance in navigating to and from the vehicle should have a Personal Care Attendant (PCA) ride with them.

REASONABLE MODIFICATION

Regional Transit will make reasonable modifications to policies, practices, or procedures when the modifications are necessary to avoid discrimination on the basis of disability or to provide program accessibility to its services, subject to the limitations of Federal Regulations 37.169(c)(1)-(3). Individuals requesting modifications to Southern Georgia Regional Transit's service shall contact the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Coordinator and describe what they need in order to use the service. Individuals requesting modifications are not required to use the term "reasonable modification" when making a request.
