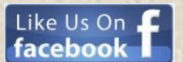

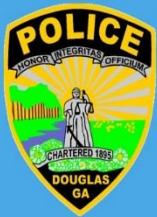
DOUGLAS FIRE DEPARTMENT AND NFPA ISSUES FIRE SAFETY TIPS FOR CHILDREN

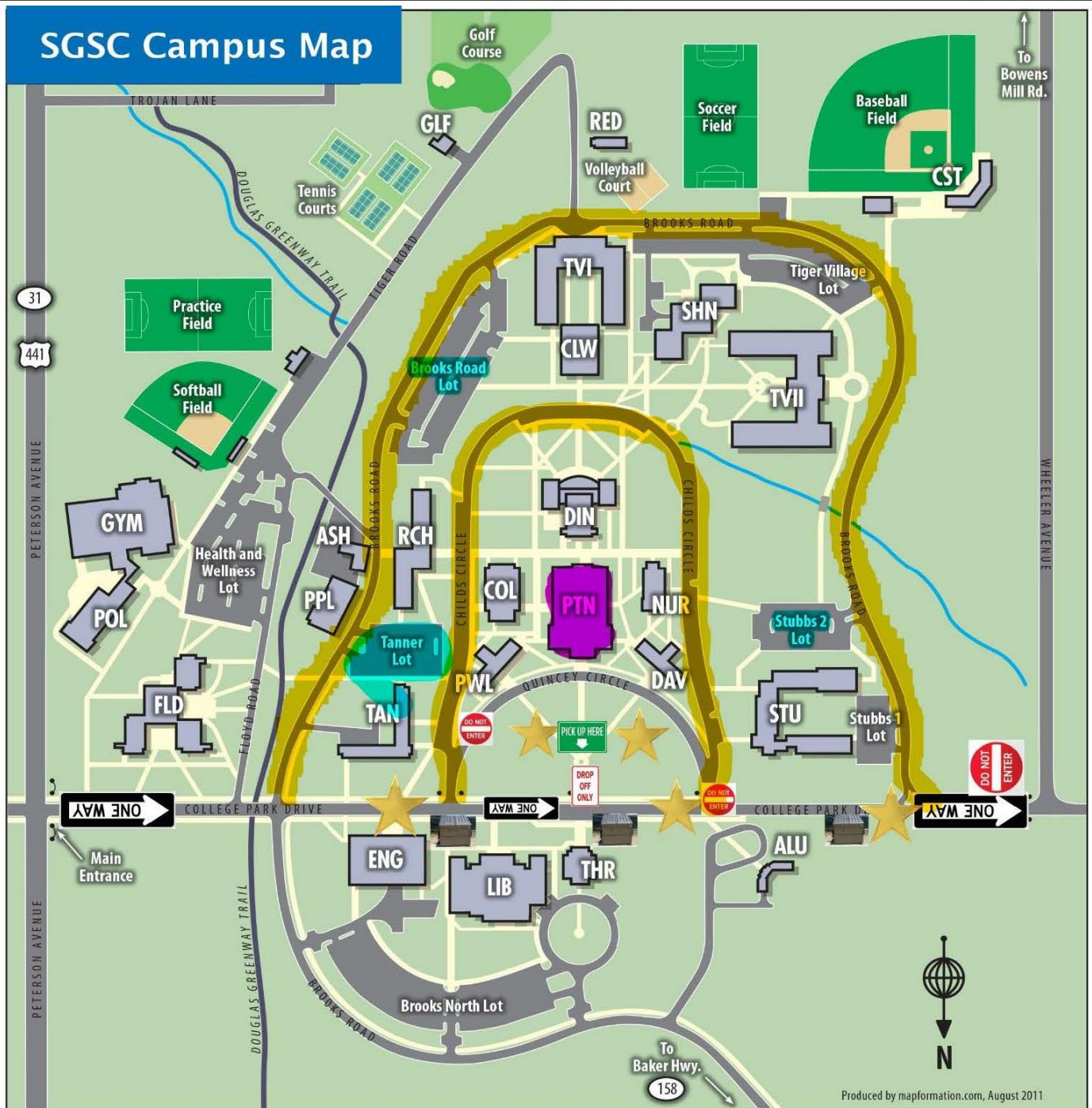

Legend:

ONE WAY Denotes traffic flow in the direction of the arrow.

DROP OFF ONLY Denotes float drop off for children that are a part of the parade.

Denotes traffic guard.

PICK UP HERE Denotes where parents/guardians may pick up child.

Yellow highlight denotes traffic path for child pick-up.

Pink/purple highlight (Peterson Hall) open for bathroom use. Secondary location for child pick-up in case of rain.

Blue highlight denotes open parking lots for parking.

END OF PARADE ROUTE & FLOAT DISBANDMENT INFORMATION

- The parade will end at South Georgia State College.
- **ALL** entries, including floats, will make a right turn off Peterson Avenue onto College Park Drive.
- College Park Drive will be a one-way street during the parade.
- Floats and entries with children will remain on College Park Drive and stop at the designated "drop-off" area for children to exit floats and be picked up by parents.
- Entries that do not have children/riders on a float, will proceed up College Park Drive and exit either by Wheeler or Shirley Avenue.
- Entries that need to disband prior to exiting the college, should pull up College Park Drive onto the right or left side.
- DUMPSTERS will be located on College Park Drive for trash – please make all efforts to throw trash in the dumpsters.

CHILD PICKUP INFORMATION FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS

- Parents of children who are riding on floats should turn onto College Park Drive from Peterson Avenue and turn left onto Brooks Road or turn left onto Child's Circle.
- Parents **must** park their vehicles either in the Brooks Road parking lots or in the Childs Circle parking spaces.
- After parking their vehicle, parents will have to walk to Quincy Circle (the grass area in front of Peterson Hall) to pick up their child.
- Once receiving their child and returning to their vehicle, parents will exit on Brooks Road or Child's Circle by following the road to College Park Drive.
- Once at College Park Drive, parents will turn left and exit the college either by continuing on Shirley Avenue or by turning left onto Wheeler Avenue.
- Peterson Hall will be open for restrooms or in case of inclement weather.

What Is The Mayors' Christmas Motorcade?

GMA began the Mayors' Christmas Motorcade in 1959 at the request of Betty Vandiver, wife of then-Governor Ernest Vandiver, as a way of providing holiday gifts for the patients of Georgia's mental health and retardation hospitals.

Originally established to provide gifts to clients at Central State Hospital in Milledgeville, the program was expanded in the 1980's to support state regional hospitals.

Without the Mayors' Christmas Motorcade, many of the clients would not receive a gift for the holidays. The Christmas spirit demonstrated by cities during the Motorcade extends beyond the holiday season. Any gifts not handed out during Christmas are used for client birthdays or given to newly arrived clients, who may need basic items. In this way, cities help the hospitals celebrate special occasions year-round and help the hospitals meet the needs of their clients.



From Vince Williams – Mayor Union City, Statewide Chair

"I encourage each city to participate in the Mayors' Motorcade. It is an opportunity to bring a little joy and hope into the lives of those who can't be with family and friends during the holidays. Our gifts may be the only ones they receive, and, by participating, it unites us in spirit and community."

How Can Your City Help?

1. Identify a program coordinator, such as the fire department, police department or civic organization to coordinate this effort. Businesses, churches and civic groups in your city can participate.
2. Organize your fundraising activities early in the year to maximize exposure.
3. Share the news! GMA has provided you with press releases for your local media. Post your information at city hall or mail with utility bills. You can even post it on the city's Facebook page or tweet the message to let everyone know where the gift drop-location (city hall/fire station/etc.) will be.
4. Each hospital sets a time and day in early December for their event, which is when the gifts are delivered. This is a special occasion for both event participants and clients by serving refreshments and providing entertainment.

Christmas Wish List and Helpful Hints

All gifts should be new and unwrapped. No glass containers or objects with sharp edges, metal or strings.

Clothing: (M-4XL Women; M-3XL Men) Jeans or Pants, Sweaters, Shorts, Long sleeve polo shirts, gloves, rain coats, ponchos, hats. Baseball Caps (no metal) socks/underwear/sports bras.

Personal Care Items: Shampoo/Conditioner, body wash, bath powder, combs/brushes, make-up kits, deodorant (no aerosols or spray cans) toothpaste, body lotion, elastic hairbands (no metal pieces).

Miscellaneous: Stationary/Stamps, pens, markers, Movies (DVD, G, PG only) Board games, (no travel games or dice games, Wii Games (no violence or parental advisory) playing cards, puzzles, word search/crossword books.

Two Weeks Left to Register for Federal Disaster Assistance in Georgia

WARNER-ROBINS, Ga. — Georgians in **Camden, Charlton, Chatham, Coffee, Glynn, Liberty** and **McIntosh** counties affected by Hurricane Irma have only two weeks to apply for federal disaster assistance that may cover temporary housing, essential home repairs and serious disaster-related needs not covered by insurance.

Register as soon as possible. The deadline to apply for assistance is **Tuesday, Nov. 14.**

FEMA assistance may include grants to help homeowners and renters pay for:

- Temporary housing for those displaced from their disaster-damaged primary homes.
- Essential repairs to owner-occupied primary homes including structural components such as foundation, exterior walls and roof, and interior areas such as ceiling and floors.
- Replacement of personal property including specialized tools for employment, household items, appliances and vehicle repair or replacement.
- Other serious disaster-related needs not covered by insurance including medical, dental, moving and child-care expenses and funeral and transportation expenses.

Hurricane Irma survivors should register for assistance even if they have insurance. FEMA cannot duplicate insurance payments, but underinsured applicants may receive help after their insurance claims have been settled.

Applying for disaster assistance is a two-step process that ensures consideration for all FEMA programs and the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) low-interest disaster loans. First, register with FEMA. Then complete and return the SBA loan application, if referred to the SBA.

The quickest way to apply for federal assistance is online at www.DisasterAssistance.gov. Survivors may also apply by phone at **800-621-3362 (Voice, 711 or VRS) or 800-462-7585 (TTY)**. Due to high demand, lines may be busy during the day. Try calling in the morning or evening when call volume may be lower. The FEMA Helpline numbers are open from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m. (ET), seven days a week until further notice.

FEMA grants do not have to be repaid. FEMA assistance is nontaxable and will not affect eligibility for Social Security, Medicaid or other federal benefits.

Next to insurance, SBA low-interest disaster loans are the survivor's primary source of funding for disaster recovery. For more information about SBA low-interest disaster loans, visit www.sba.gov/disaster. The deadline to submit SBA loan application is Nov. 14.


