DOUGLAS POLICE OFFICERS RECEIVE LIFE SAVING AWARDS DURING NATIONAL POLICE WEEK

At the City Commission meeting on Monday, May 13, 2019, two Douglas Police Officers were recognized for their life saving practices in Douglas-Coffee County. Corporal Jared Vickers was presented with a Lifesaving Award for assisting when a child at Westside Elementary School. The student had a medical emergency and Corporal Vickers revived the child after his heart stopped beating. Officer Hudson Moyle was presented with a Lifesaving Award for administering CPR to the victim of an automobile accident. Officer Moyle was traveling to school, in a neighboring jurisdiction, when he witnessed a vehicle overturned in a body of water beside the roadway. Cole Giddens, son of Jessica and Russell Giddens, was ejected and was underwater when Officer Moyle discovered him.
